The Role of the Reference Group

The WOTM Steering Group endorsed the Wai Ora Tāmaki Makaurau (WOTM) Strategic plan in November 2022 as the foundation document to underpin the next phase of work – the implementation. (*Full details of Strategy are found <u>here</u>*). The role of the Reference Group is to collaboratively design and deliver a WOTM Implementation Plan which aligns to the strategy's four strands. Each strand identifies outcomes and impacts which are prioritised and measured.

These strands are:

- Collective Impact | Ngā Pānga Tūhonotanga Better coordination and direction of the water safety effort in Tāmaki Makaurau, Auckland.
- Behaviour Change | Ngā hurihuringa whanonga Risky behaviours reduced – fewer drownings and water-related incidents.
- Increased funding into Tāmaki Makaurau, Auckland | Te whakapiki i te tahua pūtea ki Tāmaki Makaurau
- Improved Service Delivery | Te whakapaipaitanga o ngā tutukitanga ratonga Providing a clear roadmap of current service delivery, and where current or future needs exist.

Task of Reference Group

To collectively design and implement the WOTM plan with operational detail, wider sector inclusion and collaboration.
